MEASURING

All horses shall be measured in accordance with ASPC/AMHR rules. If your horse has a current year measurement card or has been measured within the last 60 days, please submit a copy of your card with your entry. All horses will be measured by the Show Steward with an official certified ASPC/AMHR measuring stick. Any other time will be at the convenience of the Show Steward upon request, but not to interfere with his/her show responsibilities.

Fri/Sat June 12th & 13th - 7:00 a.m. to 7:45 a.m.

Sunday June 14th - By Appointment

Registration papers and other necessary paperwork **MUST** be presented to the Show Steward for each animal entered at the time of measurement. To expedite measuring, please come to the measuring area with the horses free of blankets, sheets, hoods, sleezies, etc.

*****Classes will begin at 8:00 a.m. each morning*****

ENTRY PROCEDURES: ENTRIES CLOSE May 29, 2026. Entries must be on the official entry form for this show. Entry forms may be photocopied for use. All requested information must be provided for each horse entered. Forms will not be accepted unless they are complete and accompanied by required fees and a copy of the AMHR or ASPC registration papers for all horses on the entry form. All entries must include the complete name and registration number of the horse exactly as it is shown on the registration papers. **NO** numbers will be released without full payment of all fees. **NO** entries will be

accepted over the phone. Exhibitors are responsible for the accuracy of the entry forms prepared by themselves or their agents.

ENTRIES CLOSE May 29, 2026

Exhibitors must have an official amateur status to show in amateur classes. If a photocopy of your amateur card is not provided when you mail your entry, bring your amateur card to the show office when you pick up your packet. Amateur cards may also be purchased for a \$25 fee from the Show Steward after proof of current ASPC/AMHR/ASPR membership. Gelding status must be shown on registration forms, and all foals of the current year must be registered prior to the show.

There will be a \$50 charge for all checks returned due to lack of funds. This must be paid before entry numbers will be issued at this or any following show. Please make sure you visit our show secretary to close out your accounts prior to leaving the show grounds.

CONDITION OF ENTRY

Every entry for competition will be under the jurisdiction of the Northwest Miniature Horse & Shetland Pony Alliance show management, but the Northwest Miniature Horse & Shetland Pony Alliance will in no case be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur.

It shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold the horse show, NWMHSPA Cavalcade of Ponies show management, Northwest Miniature Horse & Shetland Pony Alliance, and/or the Grant County Fairgrounds & employees harmless for any loss or injury to their horses or equipment which may occur from sickness, accident or any other factor.

SHOW RULES & REGULATIONS

1. This is an ASPC/AMHR/ASPR sanctioned show, open to any ASPC/AMHR/ASPR registered horse whose exhibitor can show proof of valid registration.
2. Horse will be judged and classes will be run in accordance with ASPC/AMHR/ASPR rules. It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to know the rules and regulations as well as the requirement of each class entered. A copy of the official rule book may be found in the show office.
3. Exhibitors must provide a copy of valid registration and a copy of their Amateur Card (if applicable) with their entry form for each horse entered. Amateur Cards may be purchased from the Show Steward for \$25.

STABLING

Stalls, occupied by horses, will be available for \$90, tack stalls are available for \$75 for the weekend, which begin after 12:00 p.m. Thursday afternoon and

ends on Sunday June 14th after the last class. Exhibitors needing stalls, who wish to arrive earlier than 12:00 pm on Thursday or stay beyond Sunday evening **MUST** make special arrangements with the show manager and the Grant County Fairgrounds. The charge for additional days is \$35 per day per stall used. Horses may not be kept in trailers overnight and only two horses are allowed per stall. Stalls WILL NOT be bedded when horses arrive. **Shavings are available for sale. Outside shavings are not allowed to be used.** Stalls are assigned in the order that entries are received. Stalls **MUST** be paid for at the time of reservation. Every effort will be made to meet your request. If all stalls are reserved prior to receiving your reservation, show management will attempt to notify you by phone prior to the show. Stall charts will be posted by the club website and Facebook page prior to the show.

*****NO TRUCKS/TRAILERS Allowed in front of Arena/Office area. AT ANY TIME—NO EXCEPTIONS, regardless of whether you are just loading/unloading. There will be other areas to pull up next to the barn to load/unload. *****

COUNTY CODE REQUIREMENTS

No smoking or alcoholic beverages in buildings, barns, or arena. No parking within 30 feet of barns. No electrical cords from barns to RV.

1. Abuse to animals, show personnel or exhibitors **WILL NOT** be tolerated and will result in disqualification and exhibitor expulsion from the show.
2. Horses may not be kept in trailers overnight.
3. Horses may not be left unattended unless stalled.

GATE RULES

It is the goal of the management that this show presents the Shetland Pony and Miniature Horse in the best light possible, be entertaining to those who have come to watch the event and expediently move through the class schedule for the exhibitors. **Each exhibitor is responsible for monitoring the progress of classes and being prepared to enter the ring promptly when a class has been called, without prior public notice. The gate will remain open for two (2) minutes after each class has been called to enter the ring, unless a gate hold has been previously called. Horses not in the arena when the gate has been closed will be eliminated from the class and entry fees will not be refunded.**

Breaks will be incorporated into the show schedule for necessary tack changes and to set up equipment. Additional gate holds, not to exceed 5 minutes, requested by exhibitors may be called at the discretion of the show manager. **All gate holds must be requested at the show office at least five classes in advance of the requested hold.**

LUNCH & DINNER BREAKS

No specified lunch break has been scheduled. Show management and judge(s) will determine the progress of classes and announce a lunch break to occur as close to noon as possible. Classes will run according to the schedule unless stated otherwise in the class list. A dinner break will be called if necessary.

POST ENTRIES / ADDING CLASSES

After the closing date for entries, May 29, 2026, a flat post entry fee of \$25 **may** be assessed.

Additional classes for horses entered by May 29, 2026 may be added without additional cost. Post entries for added classes will be accepted up to five (5) classes prior to the class entering the ring, provided that the horse is determined to be eligible for entry. Post entries made for the first five classes of the day will be accepted up to one half (1/2) hour prior to the first class entering the ring. Post entries made during the show must be made at the show office and will not be accepted unless accompanied by full payment.

Management reserves the right to accept entries for unfilled classes. There will be a \$50 charge for all checks returned due to lack of funds. This must be paid before entry numbers will be issued at this or any following show. Payment shall be made at time of entry, or a blank check will be needed prior to numbers being handed out. Be aware that all final bills shall be due and payable prior to exhibitors leaving the show grounds. A list will be posted at the office of exhibitors that need to settle their accounts as well as names announced during the final show day.

SCRATCHED CLASSES - REFUNDS

No entry fees will be refunded without a Veterinarian's Certificate as to the unsoundness of the entered horse. This must be presented to the show secretary before the first class of the day. Failure to show a horse that has been entered constitutes a forfeiture of entry fees. In the event of the sudden illness of a horse after the entry deadline, exhibitor may substitute another animal at no additional charge. If done at the show, it must be done with the timeframe outlined in the Post Entry section. Refunds will be mailed to exhibitors after the conclusion of the show.

Amateur Incentive Gelding

The American Shetland Pony Club conducts an Incentive Gelding program, offering money prizes for entries in special amateur incentive gelding classes at Area National Shows, the ASPC/ASPR Congress and the AMHR Nationals. This gelding program is subsidized by ASPC/AMHR/ASPR. Entries for Gelding Incentive classes must occur by the show entry closing date. There are no post entries. Payouts are issued by ASPC home office.

Additional Awards being presented

ROOKIE AWARD - Awarded at year end

This award is presented to a new exhibitor who is new to Miniatures and Shetlands. The recipient will be selected based on their competition year at shows offered by the Area VIII clubs.

Any first- or second-year exhibitor who is a current member of the NWMHSPA is eligible. Points accumulated throughout the 2026 show season will count toward this award.

First- or second-year exhibitors who wish to be considered for this opportunity must contact a member of the Alliance Board of Directors to submit their name.

Exhibitors will be required to submit their show results at the conclusion of the show year, no later than September 1 of the competition year.

SANDI POWELL PERFORMANCE AWARD - Presented prior to the Stakes classes

This award is generously donated by Triple Heart Ranch & Training Centre in remembrance of Sandi Powell and her exceptional performance horse, Potlatch Farm Bixby Carried On.

Those who knew “Bixby” in the competition arena recognize him as one of the most talented performance horses in the Northwest. Over the course of his career, Bixby earned multiple National Champion and Grand Champion titles in Country Pleasure, Single Pleasure, Roadster, Versatility, and Hunter divisions. He truly had the heart of a champion—always willing, always competitive, and always ready to go out and drive to win. He was the very definition of a Roadster horse, eager and prepared to “drive at speed.”

Sandi loved watching her boy show and was an avid supporter of the Alliance Club. She consistently volunteered her time to help the club succeed and took great joy in attending shows—cheering not only for her own horse, but also for her fellow exhibitors.

We lost Sandi in 2021 after a short battle with cancer. Her dedication to Bixby, her belief in his abilities, and her courage to always strive for excellence are what make this award so meaningful.

THR Training is honored to sponsor and present this perpetual award to the Judges’ Choice horse that most exemplifies the definition of an outstanding individual in the Driving Performance Division.

The award is “Bixby’s” Reserve National Grand Champion Roadster Trophy. This is a perpetual award presented annually at the Alliance Show. The recipient will also receive a smaller horse head trophy to take home in recognition of this honor.

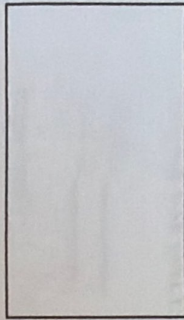
INSPIRATIONAL AWARD - *Presented prior to the Stakes classes*

This award honors individuals whose selfless acts of kindness, generosity, and encouragement make a positive impact on others and on our industry as a whole.

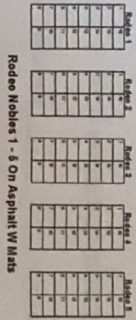
A nomination box will be located in the show office, and we encourage everyone to submit the name of someone they believe is a true “Inspiration” to those around them.

This award will be presented at the conclusion of the show.

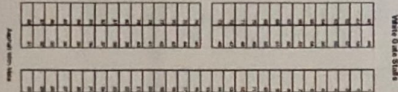


Rodeo Arena

Nobles Located East Behind Rodeo Arena

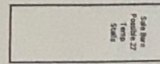


Rodeo Nobles 1 - 5 On Asphalt Mats

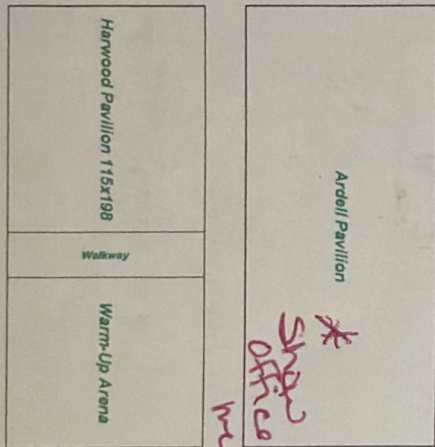

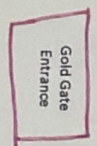


Sale Barn 27

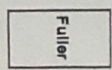

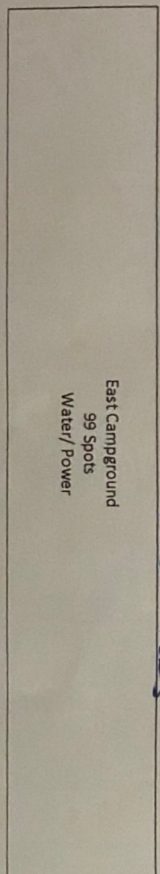
